BEWARE:

You will have to be in deportation proceedings in order to be considered for 10-year law protection. Immigration must charge or arrest you to start the case and you will be required to appear in front of a judge. Only then can you apply for the 10-year law.


ALWAYS seek advice from a lawyer! If you lose your case, you may be deported.



The law you asked about has many difficult requirements, not only living here continuously for 10 years and having U.S. citizen children.





If your child might die, that may qualify as the kind of hardship the law requires.





BEWARE:

To qualify for the 10-year law, which is called "Cancellation of Removal," a person must provide documents that prove 3 things:



I. His/her deportation would cause a U.S. citizen or permanent resident child, spouse, or parent a hardship that is much greater than what every other person would suffer if deported.



2. He/she has no disqualifying criminal record, has good moral character, and deserves to be allowed to remain in the U.S.



3. He/she has not left the U.S. during the 10 years for any long or significant trips.



Here is a list of some documents you should gather in case you end up in front of a judge and need to apply for the ten-year law.

☐ Birth certificates of the U.S. citizen children ☐ Medical reports that show medical hardship to a U.S. citizen or permanent resident child or other family member if you had to leave the country Other documents that show hardship to U.S. citizen or permanent resident family members ☐ School records for the children ☐ Your employment and tax records ☐ Letters and other documents showing you have good moral character and have lived in the U.S. for at least 10 years


