If you work for a living, you may be eligible for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and you could get up to \$6,775 cash when you file your 2012 tax returns.

1. Find a FREE tax preparer.

Well-trained professional tax volunteers are available to help you prepare and file your federal and state income taxes for FREE!

The tax preparer will help you determine if you qualify for the federal Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). The EITC refund is based on family size and income and could provide your household with a refund of up to \$6,775.

2. File for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

You qualify if:

- You worked and earned income in 2012,
- You have a valid social security number, and

If your family has:	and you earned less than:	you can get up to:
No qualifying children	\$19,190	\$546
One qualifying child	\$42,130	\$3,644
Two qualifying children	\$47,162	\$6,021
Three or more qualifying children	\$50,270	\$6,775

Qualifying and credit amounts are based on a married couple jointly filing their federal and state returns. Alimony and child support do not count towards income
