Background	Chapter 305 of the Acts of 2008 added a new chapter 176R to the General Laws entitled "Consumer Choice of Nurse Practitioner Services." Under this law, patients may choose to be diagnosed or treated by a nurse practitioner. This must be recognized by insurance carriers, including MassHealth. State Letter 1345 (effective February 6, 2009) adds nurse practitioner to the
	definition of a competent medical authority.
Purpose of Memo	This Field Operations Memo informs TAO staff that effective February 6, 2009 any form requiring the signature of a competent medical authority can be completed and signed by a nurse practitioner and will be an acceptable proof of a disability, provided the disability described on the form meets the requirements for EAEDC or TAFDC.
