Re:	SNAP – Excluding	Combat Pay from Household Income	
Overview	SNAP regulation mandates the exclusion of certain combat-related pay from household income. Combat pay earned by a service member while s/he is actively deployed or serving in a Federally-designated combat zone is noncountable for SNAP purposes. This allowance is usually paid in addition to the service member's basic pay. Only the portion of a service member's income that is available to the household may be counted for SNAP purposes.
