Re:	Cross Programs: Noncitizen Resources
Overview	Department policies and procedures have long required that clients be U.S. citizens or have a verified eligible noncitizen status to receive benefits. Although there have been no changes to noncitizen eligibility for DTA programs, new federal rules and reports have raised questions and concerns from clients and stakeholders.
Purpose	 This purpose of this Transmittal is to remind staff: there are no changes to DTA program eligibility as it relates to noncitizens; and of updated noncitizen resources.

Staff Obligations	The Noncitizen Resource Brochure (English and Spanish) has been updated to reflect changes in contact information.
	If a client has immigration related questions be sure to ask the client if they need a copy of the <i>What Noncitizens Need To Know</i> or the <i>Noncitizen Resource Brochure</i> .
	Staff are reminded that they are not to provide advice on or to speculate to the effects of immigration policies. Clients with questions about the potential impact of benefits on their status must be referred to one of the community partner agencies listed on the <i>Noncitizen Resource Brochure</i> .
