Corrected Online Guide Pages

Overview

This Online Guide Transmittal changes two pages in the SNAP Work Requirements section to update information about exemptions to program participation requirements for unfit for work observed. The updates are as follows:

- the reference to exemption due to unfit for work observed has been removed from the E & T section; and
- the reference to exemption from E & T participation due to unfit for work observed has been removed from the Work Program section.

Work Requirements Medical Form

Reminder: The *Food Stamp Work Requirement Medical Report* form may be used to verify that a SNAP client is unfit for work due to one or more of the following situations:

- pregnancy;
- participation in a vocational or rehabilitation program;
- participation in mental health counseling;
- participation in a drug or alcohol treatment program; and
- a mental or physical illness which reduces the individual's ability to financially support him or herself.

Work Requirements Medical Form (continued) **Note:** A client who is SNAP Work Program required or SNAP E & T required may also verify that he or she is unfit for work using a letter or form from a competent medical authority or facility providing

services.

Staff must make the form available to anyone claiming an unverified Work Requirement exemption for a mental and/or physical illness or disability (temporary or permanent), which results in the client being unfit for work and encourage him or her to have this form completed.

For SNAP Work Program requirement purposes, unfit for work means the client has a physical or mental illness or impairment that reduces his or her ability to financially support him or herself. A case manager can make such a determination without further verification if it is apparent that a client is unable to work. For example, a recent amputee who is recovering from surgery may be deemed unfit for work.
