**Overview**

The Department and the Community Colleges have developed alternative programs to the community colleges' traditional Associate's Degree two-year programs. The new programs are short-term skills training programs to be offered at participating community colleges.

This memo provides an overview of the Community College Programs (CCPs) and instructions to Transitional Assistance Office staff for coding participants on ESP-MIS.

**Community College Programs (CCPs)**

CCPs are four-week to nine-month certificate programs which integrate academic and occupational learning and include basic adult education, short-term skills training, orientation, job search, job placement and follow-up services. There are two levels:

- Level 1 a curriculum of non-credit courses for TAFDC recipients with less than a high school education that combines Adult Basic Education (ABE) services and skills training services in a specified non-credit course; and
- Level 2 a curriculum of credit courses for TAFDC recipients who have a GED or high school diploma.

CCP participants must be tracked in ESP-MIS with skills training Code 041. These programs are considered **skills training**

programs and **not** educational programs. Referrals must be completed and forwarded to the participating community college via an ESP-16.

Note: An EDP must be completed.
