Transitional Benefit Alternative (TBA): 5 Month Cert. Period	Certain families who were terminated from TAFDC due to income, etc.	Recertification after 5 months. NO reporting requirements.
Bay State CAP: 36 Month Cert. Period	Single SSI recipients.	Recertification after 36 months (may be renewed by SSA, or DTA will send a short Recertification form). NO reporting requirements.
